 - connecting the work that our teams do everyday and what we're working to achieve for the city
- Provides clarity of purpose so that the whole organisation is focused on a smaller number of things that matter to people in Sheffield which in turn shape our financial strategy, workforce plans and performance framework.
 - We will have a clear view on what the Council want to achieve for the city, the resources available to deliver and how citizens can hold the us to account for delivering.
- Will provide purpose, certainty and a positive plan for the next 4 years (2024-28).


