

## Leading a national civic university movement

In 2020 Sheffield Hallam was chosen to be the host of the Civic University Network, funded by the UPP Foundation with partners including the Department for Education, Carnegie Trust UK and Arts Council England.


The Civic University Network supports universities across the UK to develop and embed civic aspirations at an institutional level, particularly through developing and publishing Civic University Agreements.

We work with governments and strategic partners to ensure that a university's geographic role and responsibility is used more effectively as an agent to drive positive societal change.


Our programme of work includes webinars delivering practical support, virtual case study showcases, and in-depth analysis of opportunities for – and barriers to – maximising civic impact.



"Top-down" pressures such as Levelling Up and a "bottom-up" moral imperative to support communities are resulting in increasing pressure on HEIs to respond to the place agenda and maximise their social value for public good.




The potential of HEIs to transform and contribute to the place agenda is under-realised and constrained by lack of good evidence, joined up structures for (local) connectivity, lack of consistent and available measurement, and challenges of strategy and capacity in how the sector operates.



The NCIA will connect evidence and intelligence, strategic and operational capacity and systematic measurement to accelerate civic intervention and impact within and across places.

We will provide guidance, tools and support to help universities work in partnership with place to deepen the impact of their civic ambitions.
