	<p>Minutes and Matters Arising</p> <p>The minutes were agreed as a true record of the meeting. There were no matters arising.</p>	
2.	<p>Workshop on City Goals</p> <p>Tom Berresford, Dark Matter Labs and Angela Foulkes, Principal, The Sheffield College</p> <p>Over the summer the Stewardship Group met to review data and information collected during the engagement phase (an online survey has also been running). The first draft of the Goals has been produced with a view to going out to hold public conversations from later this month.</p> <p>The final version/agreed goals should be ready towards November, and we plan to hold a launch event in January.</p> <p>In terms of the ask for the workshop today. Around the room are sheets containing the goals broken down and organised by process. We want members to use sticky dots to indicate consent, or otherwise, and in the second part of the session is to generate alternative options then review and vote again.</p> <p><u>Reflections following the exercise:</u> The process worked well and facilitated good discussions/conversations.</p> <p>Outputs in an article would be helpful. There was quite a lot of consensus.</p> <p>Some topics are missing: environment/resilience/climate emergency/inequalities/ adverse childhood experiences/food security/austerity/success/wealth/ prosperity and how to frame these meaningfully to the city. Also, education/health and transport – everything that needs to be included to make a healthy home and happy families. Fairness/talent/inclusive growth/urgency and agility.</p> <p>Looking 10 – 15 years ahead – what impact will the goals have for the next generation – nurturing leadership.</p> <p>We need to go harder on safety. The Goals currently seem a bit too nice and comfortable – we need to be brave, challenge and tackle barriers. How do we instil the belief that voices are heard in this process?</p> <p>The city goals should be linked to an action plan which identifies which institution/partner, or individual, should lead on the specific areas identified.</p> <p><u>Agreed</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Any further comments to be sent directly to Tom Beresford or a member of the S&P team. Dark Matter Labs to provide an updated set of Goals when there is a further iteration. The timeline needs to be looked at again so that the feedback can be properly reflected before wider public consultation (it's currently determined by organisational timelines) - Angela and the team to examine how to extend the Goals timeline. 	<p>All</p> <p>AF/LW</p>
