Partnership Update & Hot Topics Laura White, Partnership Manager • Laura attended an expert advisory group workshop in London on Monday 10 th September on 'The NHS as an Anchor Institution'. • Sandi Carman has taken over as Chair of the Progressive Procurement Partnership. Universal Credit Cat Arnold, Policy & Improvement Officer, Sheffield City Council provided a briefing to Board on Universal Credit in Sheffield. It included information about Universal Credit itself and what is being done to prepare for the implementation of Universal Credit in Sheffield in November/December. 4.	 Dan Jarvis, Sheffield City Region Mayor Mayor Jarvis has now been in office for 3 months. He gave the following update about achievements so far: The Combined Authority is working more cooperatively and productively, however Governance is to be reviewed. The next meeting of the Authority is due to take place at the end of October and it is hoped that agreement about the review with be reached with Local Authorities at that meeting. The Local Enterprise Partnership has appointed six new, diverse members. Inclusive Growth – Mayor Jarvis is keen to develop work being done locally around procurement and will liaise with the Procurement Partnership via Sandi Carman. Mayor Jarvis has taken a seat on Transport for the North. A bid has been written for £120m to the Transforming Cities Fund. Mayor Jarvis will be attending the launch of the South Yorkshire Futures initiative next Tuesday. Mayor Jarvis is meeting with Chris Boardman, Manchester's Active Travel Commissioner next week. All Local Authorities have agreed to work together and pool resources to help eliminate the effects of cold weather on the elderly and vulnerable. Mayor Jarvis is looking at the work undertaken in Manchester with the homeless and this will be debated in more detail in the autumn. 	SC

	<i>Brexit</i> : a discussion followed about international trade changes and difficulties which may arise from a trade deal not being in place by November 13 th . The Global Innovation Corridor is a game changer we should be taking to the rest of the world – Grant Thornton may be able to offer some time to promote. Mayor Jarvis met with Brexit Cabinet Office recently and he will also be travelling to China next month to promote the region. The Government is about to launch a consultation on how the Shared Prosperity Fund will work in practice.	
5.	Street Culture and City Centre Challenges Inspector John Mallows and PCSO Steve Hart, Sheffield Central Neighbourhood Policing Team	
	Problem street culture is associated with 5 primary activities based on South Yorkshire Police's professional experiences: • Begging • Rough sleeping/homelessness • Spice consumption and dealing	
	 Street drinking Associated anti-social behaviour (eg verbal abuse/threats, litter, public urination) 	
	Addressing street culture matters due to its impact on the community and on the individual. This is enforced via an interventionist approach – some examples are high visibility patrols, dispersal notices, community protection notices, targeting dealers, public space protection orders.

	Questions/Comments: These are complex social problems that the Police Force is trying to deal with at a time when the blue line is thin and Local Authorities are challenged financially.	
	South Yorkshire Police are trying to get the message out to members of the public that giving money to beggars is counter-productive.	
	PCSO Hart works with students who shadow his street visits. This offer is also made to Board members who would like to join him on one of his morning walks.	
	The Police are working with partners to develop knowledge about the impact and market of Spice.	
	Some investment to look at the issues around street culture should become available through the Sheffield Outcomes Fund (Adults with Complex Needs).

6.	City of Sanctuary	
	Sarah Eldridge, Coordinator, Sheffield City of Sanctuary	
	Sarah outlined the global and UK context of refugees, the definitions, facts and figures, plus what's happening in Sheffield. People are still crossing the Mediterranean, taking hazardous journeys from distant parts of Africa. There have been 1,565 recorded deaths in the Mediterranean so far in 2018.	
	Everyone has the right to seek protection and claim asylum in a state outside their country of origin. An asylum seeker is somebody who has applied for refugee protection from the UK government, and is awaiting a decision. A refugee is someone who has been granted asylum.	
	In the past year 68.5million have been forced to flee their homes. In 2017/18, 27,044 people applied for asylum in the UK. In Sheffield 794 asylum seekers are in Home Office accommodation.	
	 Sheffield was the first to join the Gateway protection scheme Sheffield is rich in asylum-supporting organisations and individuals Sheffield was the first City of Sanctuary – founded in 2007. 	
	The Sanctuary on Chapel Walk was opened this year to provide advice and support to refugees and asylum seekers.
